Travel Grant "IAU TRAIL WORLD CHALLENGE" HUNTSVILLE (USA), December 8th 2007.

The I.A.U. has recently worked out a remodelled system with regard to the allocation of the Travel Grants for the Major IAU Competitions (MIAUC's).

In this new system we consider :

- the real travel distance to the venue of the competition,
- the quality of the runners based on ranking lists of the last two years (2005 and 2006) and their results in IAU labelled races till November 12th '07.
- the number of athletes your Federation is sending to the competition (individuals and/or full teams)

The allocated Travel Grant for your National Federation for the **IAU TRAIL WORLD CHALLENGE 2007** in Huntsville (USA) at December 8th 2007 is based on the following figures:

Travel zone :	ZONE 1

You'll receive :	280 USD	210 USD	140 USD	70 USD
All these grants are cumulative Grants are paid for maximum 3 athletes (men + women) per country				

This is the minimum Travel Grant which your Federation is entitled to receive. This amount is subject to an increase, depending upon the number of athletes that take part in the event but it will not be less than listed here.
