ANNUAL REPORT - 2006

Dear Members

Your committee is pleased to report on the activities of your Association for the year ended 31 December 2006.

OVERVIEW AND FUTURE DIRECTION

The purpose of your Association is to promote the sport of ultra-running; that is events longer than a standard marathon. In this regard, your committee is desirous of attracting more runners to ultra events in the first instance; secondly, in improving the quality of performances and thirdly, of ensuring that the athletes remember the event as a satisfying experience.

Your committee is pleased to report that the number of participants in marathon and ultra events in Australia has increased significantly over the last 5 years. We have prepared a comprehensive review of the period 2002 - 2006, with accompanying statistics.

This 5 year review shows that

- (a) the numbers participating in ultras (excl Trailwalkers, Six Foot & Great Ocean Road) is bouyant at 900, up from 600 in 2002
- (b) the numbers participating in conventional marathons is bouyant at 7100, up from 5500 in 2002
- (c) the numbers participating in the two 100 km Oxfam trailwalkers is very strong at 3800 up from 400 in 2002.

This being the case, it is obvious that the sport needs proper marketing, the interest is there and the people to target are those who participate in the marathons and larger team events.

A plan for the next 5 years moving forward (2007 – 2011) has been prepared and a copy is available at www.ultraoz.com along with the 5 year review.

Of particular significance is the plan to intitiate a stage race from Melbourne-Sydney-Brisbane in 2009. This is not an initiative of your Association as such, but AURA is involved in providing assistance. Obviously, should the event become a reality, the resultant publicity will put ultra running firmly back on the map.

As part and parcel of this plan, is the need for Colac 6 day race to continue or, if not, for a suitable replacement race to be established. In this regard, AURA will be doing all possible to assist. The nub of the 5 year plan is the need for proper marketing of ultras so as to attract more people to the sport, an encouragement for NSW race directors in particular to organise more races and an overall need for far better communication between AURA state reps and the race directors in their respective states.

International competition

IAU 50km trophy race

The IAU 50km trophy race was held at Winschoten Holland on 16 September 2006. We are pleased to report that Australia's representatives acquitted themselves well. Results were

OPERATIONS

Records. David Billett has the unenviable and painstaking task of seeking out race results from race directors, sifting through the results to determine who are AURA members, allocating the appropriate number of points, checking for records, scrutinising lapsheets etc. Thanks to David for a job well done. Full details appear or records awarded and points gained appear in each issue of Ultramag.

100, 200 & 250 Club. This award is made to those who have achieved 100 mile, 200 km and 250 km in 24 hours track. To qualify it is essential that the feat be achieved on a standard athletic track or, if on a road course, then one that has been properly measured by AURA. It will also need to be performed in a race (not a solo run) and verified by the Race Director. Those who achieve this feat will be included in the 100, 200 or 250 Club listing which will appear from time to time in AURA's official publication, Ultramag and on the website. A commemorative polo shirt is available for purchase. Runners who have achieved this feat in the past will be automatically recognised.

Ultramag. Kevin Cassidy does a superb job in producing Ultramag, AURA's official publication. The magazine, produced quarterly, contains details of forthcoming races, race results, race reports, various stories, pictures and details of records. The publication has been upgraded to include more pics and a colour cover. There will be some advertising content, the purpose of which is to defray costs of publication. The magazine is far more attractive with the colour content. We commend Kevin for his untiring efforts in publishing Ultramag and we thank Bruce and Sue Cook for their skills in assisting with the transformation to part and, hopefully eventually, full colour.

Website. Thanks to Kevin Tiller of <http://www.coolrunning.com.au/> who provides the link through www.ultraoz.com. There is a wealth of information on the website, including race calendar, race results, records and stories.

Ultra Hosts Network. This initiative, introduced by David Criniti, is essentially an exchange program for AURA members. Anybody who is willing to host a runner, coming to compete at a local race, in turn is provided with a list of other hosts, and will thus have the opportunity to be hosted by a fellow ultra runner, free of charge, whilst competing away from home.

UHN has already attracted members from 6 states across Australia, and will hopefully continue to enjoy a healthy growth throughout its first year. As well as making travelling cheaper for AURA members, and promoting networking amongst members, it is also hoped that the initiative will help boost participation rates for some of Australia's smaller ultramarathons.

Running apparel. A new range of apparel is available including polo shirts, AURA 100 club shirts, tee shirts, running singlets and caps. Please support AURA by wearing this apparel at the events you contest. For further information contact the clothing officer, Sandra Howorth on 0407 301 058.

New Logo. As you may see from the report, a new logo has been adopted. Sincere thanks to David Waugh for his assistance in this regard.

AWARDS AND PRIZES

Australian Male Ultra Runner of the Year. Kelvin Marshall (42) from Elsternwick, Victoria. Kelvin placed 5th in Bogong to Hotham, won Mansfield to Buller, 2nd in Caboolture 12 hour, won Maroondah 50km, 12 at Six Foot, won Walhalla 50km in May, 2nd AURA member at Great Ocean Road, first AURA at Tamborine Trek, 4th in Gold Coast 100, won the Warrumbungle 50km, 6th at Brindabella, won Mt Feathertop and 2nd at Kurrawa 50km. In between this hectic schedule he found time to run the 1100 km Trans Gaule stage 18-day stage race in France. He ran his 300th marathon or greater at Kurrawa in December, is a great ambassador for AURA and for the sport of ultrarunning.

Australian Female Ultra Runner of the Year. Siri Terjesen (30) from Brisbane, Qld. Siri won the Caboolture 6 hour in February, Six Foot track in March, Canberra 50km and Mt Mee 50 km in April, Glasshouse 50 and Tamborine Trek in May, placed 3rd in the IAU50km trophy race in September in

Holland and then was first AURA female in the Kurrawa 50km in December. Siri is also a great ambassador for AURA and for the sport and is a regular contributor to running magazines and to *ultrarunning* in Wikipedia.

Rising Star Awards. This award is to the 25's and under who showed outstanding potential. The male award this year goes to Chris Hills (21) of Launceston, who was also a joint winner of this award last year. Chris came 12th at Six Foot Track, just behind Don Wallace and Tim Sloan, winning the 20 to 30 age group section. He entered the Gold Coast 100 but was forced to withdraw at 62.5 km because of illness, after running well early on. Then in October, Chris ran the 8th South African Kalahari Augrabies Extreme marathon of 250km where he placed second in 28:48:00! This is a self-sufficient 7 day stage race.

Cliff Young Gumboot award. This award is to the best-performed, male or female, O60 AURA member at 24-hrs track. This award goes to Deryck Skinner (73) who walked 163.806 km at Adelaide in October and 162.8 km in the first 24 hours at the Gold Coast 48 hour race in August.

Bryan Smith Award. This award is to the AURA member who, in the opinion of the committee, has made a major contribution to the sport of ultrarunning, especially in the year under review. This year the award goes to Anubha Baird and the Sri Chinmoy Marathon Team, organisers of the Adelaide 24 hour track race.

AURA points award. This award is determined by a complex points system where the AURA member receives two points for starting, two points for each 100 km run, bonus points for placing in races, bonus points for breaking Australian or world records and bonus points for attaining IAU benchmarks. For 2006, the award goes to Siri Terjesen (74 points), followed by Kelvin Marshall (71), Robert Boyce (67), Garry Wise (53) and Rodney Ladyman (50). Full details appear in the March issue of Ultramag.

FINANCIAL & LEGAL

Results and position. The accompanying statements of account reveal an excess of income over expenditure of \$2,954 (2005, \$1,072). Donations were higher, thanks to a bequest of \$5,000 from the Estate of the Late Nigel Aylott and a donation of \$2,000 from his mother Mrs Jan Aylott. Expenditure on clothing was abnormally high at \$5,846. Accounting policy dictates that expenditure on clothing be expensed in the year in which it's incurred. Stock of clothing at year end is not brought to account.

Travel costs for sending teams overseas amounted to \$5600. Your committee is very proud of the fact that, at long last, we have been able to make a meaningful contribution to the cost of sending representative teams overseas.

Net assets at year end amounted to \$12,073 compared with \$9,119 at the end of the previous year. Overall, your Association's financial position, when considered in conjunction with planned initiatives, is considered to be quite sound.

Memberships. Memberships at year end remained steady at approximately 260. It is hoped that with more and more publicity for events that event numbers will continue to increase, as well as the number of AURA members. Members are asked to encourage others to join. It is considered that AURA offers a considerable amount for its members with the new colour magazine, championship races, rankings, records, 100 club, points race and the Ultra Hosts Network, various awards etc.

AUSTRALIAN ATHLETIC FEDERATION

Your Association became a member of the Australian Athletic Federation (AAF) in November 2002. Other members comprise Athletics Australia (AA), Australian Track & Field Coaches Association, Australian Masters Athletics Inc., Australian Athletic Confederation (pro runners), School Sport Australia, Australian Federation of Race Walking Clubs and Australian Mountain Runners Association Inc. The objective is to have one unified body to advance the interests of the

various members of the athletic family. We acknowledge the assistance and support of Athletics Australia, the principal and dominant member, for which we are most grateful.
